Hi Mark,

Here are some views on the SNH note:

Q1. Take an easily understood and simple approach on agreeing what the uplands are. The second option in the possible approaches seems a good way forward

Q2. The key benefits are: opportunities for tourism, leisure, energy generation, niche food and wood products, carbon sequestration, habitat, water supply

Q3. Carbon sequestration and source of renewables

Q4, 5, 6. An upland vision should enable people to get a clear mental picture of what the future for our uplands should be stirring up action so that all people with an interest in the uplands help deliver the preferred future. It must therefore be positive and ambitious covering social, economic and environmental opportunities. Questions 4,5, & 6 suggest that it is some form of directive that it being considered rather than an inspirational vision?

Q7. Stakeholders that live, work, own land and visit the uplands should be primary stakeholders followed by those bodies that have an interest in specialist topics.

Q8. All encompassing process involving all the stakeholders in sessions where all views are respected and listened to, and collaboration is encouraged. Sessions to be facilitated by independent professional facilitators

Q9. An organisation/person that is slightly removed from the issue
