SNH Consultation on Wild Land Guidance

Response on behalf of Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park

Question 1 – Does the draft guidance provide a clear explanation of the methodology and general principles for assessing the impact of development proposals on Wild Land Areas?

Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park consider that the methodology and general principles for the assessment process are very clear.

We have only one comment to make with regard to clarity on who to contact in paragraph 14 under 'The Assessment Process'. In this regard we suggest an additional bullet point be added saying 'Contact SNH or the relevant Park if the site in question is

within a National Park.' This would tie in with paragraph 5 under 'Using this Guidance' and be clarification of the decision maker in the case of development within a National Park.

Question 2 - Are the examples with Annex 2 helpful in illustrating the approach to assessing impacts?

Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park consider that the range of development examples and the assessment steps tables in Annex 2 are excellent in illustrating the type of thinking to be presented as part of a wild land assessment.
