






Melfort Park: Clydebank

The site of the former St Eunan's Primary School, which is located in a residential neighbourhood of Clydebank, was inaccessible and severely contaminated. A new community greenspace will include biodiversity areas, raised bed allotments, outdoor education exercise areas, as well as new pedestrian routes between the town centre and housing areas.



Halfway Park: Glasgow



A former golf course, this site has been transformed into a popular urban park. The park links three distinct communities through a series of inviting paths and cycleways. Greater Easterhouse

This Glasgow site covers 29 hectares of land – a total which equates to over 30 Hampden Parks! A skilful transformation of vacant and derelict land in the eastern edge of the city has created an attractive urban greenspace which offers green corridors linking the area with the Seven Lochs Wetland Park. And ... the project has been completed whilst accommodating a nationally important population of water voles.
