

## Canal & North Gateway: Glasgow

This large project has seen two distinct areas developed to integrate valuable greenspace into the canal corridor between Firhill and Sighthill. The Claypits Local Nature Reserve provides a barrier free path and boardwalk network, mountain bike trail, and canal pedestrian bridges. It is developing into an important element in a green corridor which links Hamiltonhill with Glasgow city.

Active management of the water level in the canal provides vital flood mitigation and this 'Smart canal' is a vivid example of modern blue/green infrastructure underpinning regeneration.



## Middlefield: Aberdeen

The project centres on the greenspace in and around the Middlefield area of the Granite City, an area first developed for housing back in the 1930s. A new high-quality outdoor recreational space addresses flooding concerns and has been created for residents to relax, socialise and exercise in the very heart of the community. The transformation includes a variety of active travel routes, play materials, outdoor learning opportunities, wildflower meadows and picnic areas.
