Who collects your personal data

The data controller is Scottish Natural Heritage known as NatureScot at:

What personal data is collected and how it's used

NatureScot will use the information from the Fit and Competent Registration application for its licensing functions, including:

- processing and issuing a Fit and Competent Registration
- monitoring compliance with registration conditions
- reports and returns

The personal information NatureScot processes will include your:

- name
- contact details
- postcode

The legal basis for processing your personal data

Processing your data is necessary for the:

- performance of a task carried out in the public interest
- exercise of official authority vested in the data controller

The task is to conduct the functions in relation to licences as delegated by The Scottish Ministers to Scottish Natural Heritage under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 2018.

Consent to process your data

The processing of your data is not based on consent, you cannot withdraw it.

Who NatureScot shares your personal data with

We may share your information with third parties at certain stages of the Fit and Competent Registration process.

We may do this to:

- check information you provide on a Fit and Competent Registration application
- monitor effects on protected species
- provide the service

We only share information when necessary and anonymously whenever possible.

NatureScot shares information with the following organisations for the purposes listed.

- 1. Statutory nature conservation bodies: Compliance, enforcement, licence assessment
- 2. Scottish Government: Compliance, enforcement, licence assessment

- 3. **Authorised enforcement agencies, for example, Police Scotland:** Compliance, enforcement activity
- 4. **Postcode lookup service:** To return addresses against the postcode you enter

We may make some information available where there's public interest in wildlife licensing and who it issued licences or registrations to. Information released may include, but is not limited to:

- your name or business name
- application, registration and licence details
- reports and returns

We will not release information for licensed activities that are sensitive or could harm people, species or habitats, for example names and addresses of individuals, locations of licensed activities.

We respect your personal privacy when responding to access to information requests. We only share information when necessary to meet the statutory requirements of the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004 and Freedom of Information Act 2000.

How long NatureScot holds personal data

We will keep your personal data for seven years after the expiry of your licence or longer if stated in the licence conditions.

We will keep any feedback data captured in relation to developing or improving the applications for two years.

What happens if you do not provide the data

We will be unable to grant your Fit and Competent Registration if you do not provide the data.

Use of automated decision-making or profiling

The information you provide is not used for:

- automated decision making (a decision made by automated means without any human involvement)
- profiling (automated processing of personal data to learn certain things about you)

Transfer of data outside the European Economic Area (EEA)

We will not transfer your data outside the EEA.

Your rights
