Before you begin

NatureScot has a statutory responsibility for the sustainable management of deer in Scotland.

Any control of deer must be carried out in line with the <u>Deer (Scotland) Act 1996</u>, and certain activities require a specific legal authorisation.

You can use this form to apply for permission to:

- shoot female deer out of season
- shoot deer at night (from one hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise)

You must use a different form to apply to shoot female deer over one year old between 1 April and 31 August to prevent damage to agricultural land or woodland.

For further information, read our authorisations guidance.

General authorisation for deer

The General Authorisation allows the owner or occupier of land to cull deer out of season to prevent damage to agricultural land or enclosed woodland.

You do not need to apply for the right to use the General Authorisation but you must ensure that all conditions are understood and followed.

Abuse of, or failure to comply with, the conditions of the general authorisation could constitute an offence.

Out of Season Authorisation 5(6)

Required to shoot female deer during the day in the closed season:

- 6 February 31 March and 1 September 20 October (red, sika and fallow deer)
- 1 September 20 October (roe deer)

This authorisation can be granted to prevent damage to unenclosed woodland, the natural heritage or in the interests of public safety.

Night Shooting Authorisation 18(2)

Required to shoot deer between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise regardless of the time of year or target species.

You must use a different form to apply to shoot female deer over one year old between 1 April and 31 August.
